IMPORTANT UPDATES ON SCREENING AND REGISTRATION PROCESS

At the recent Annual General Meeting (AGM) in June, Hockey NL's Board of Directors approved several key updates to the screening and registration process for the upcoming season. To be added to a team, staff members must complete the Coach 1 or Coach 2 Learning Lab courses and, if applicable, the respective Pathway. These qualifications must be reflected in their Hockey Canada Registry (HCR) profile. Additionally, all individuals must have a current Vulnerable Sector Check (VSC), Criminal Record Check (CRC), and Screening Application visible on their HCR profile. These checks are valid for three seasons unless otherwise specified, and members are encouraged to apply early to avoid delays. Further, all members (players and staff) are required to complete the Respect in Sport for Activity Leaders and Respect in Sport for Parents courses to be eligible for team registration. If a member has not completed these requirements and is not approved in the HCR, they are ineligible and uninsured to participate in any practices or games.
